

Juneau County Marriage License Information

- Applicants must apply in the county where you live. Juneau County residents apply at the Courthouse in Mauston
- \$60.00 fee
- Each person must know their social security number.
- Each person must have a certified birth certificate - listing their parent's full name. You get this at the Register of Deeds Office in the county you were born in (we do not accept hospital or Xerox copies)
- If either party has been married before, we need a certified Divorce Judgment or certified Death Certificate (applies to most recent marriage)
- There is a 6 month waiting period after any divorce in Wisconsin or any other state, before a party can remarry in Wisconsin.
- There is a 6-day waiting period after you apply for the license, counting the day you applied.
- The license is good for 30 days after it is issued.
- You will need proof of Juneau County Residency (a Wisconsin driver license with a Juneau County address).
- You will need to know the date you are being married, and the City, Village or Township you will be married in.
- The Applicants must know the Officiates name, address and phone number.
- Both applicants should come to the Juneau County Clerk's office before 11:30 a.m. or before 4:00 p.m.
- If an Officiate is from out of state they need a letter of sponsorship from a church within Wisconsin.
