PUBLIC NOTIFICATION: POSSIBLE COVID-19 EXPOSURE IN JUNEAU COUNTY

The Juneau County Health Department is notifying the public of a possible COVID-19 exposure associated with a Juneau County event. It is not identified as an outbreak at this time but this status may change as the disease investigation continues. An outbreak is defined by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services as two or more laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the same facility or associated with a single event, with onset within two maximum COVID-19 incubation periods of each other (28 days).

If you attended the event listed below, you may have been exposed to COVID-19.

If you are experiencing any symptoms (headache, fatigue, cough, shortness of breath, fever, digestive discomfort), please contact your healthcare provider, seek a COVID-19 test, and stay home.
