Subject: Castle Rock Water Flow Study

Dear Neighbor:

During the week of Aug. 31, through Sept. 4, the Wisconsin River Power Company will be conducting a river flow study downstream of the Castle Rock Hydroelectric Dam. This study is in consult with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, US Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

Flows discharged from the dam will be modified about every 3 hours. These changes may cause higher or lower than expected flow conditions, unanticipated water elevation changes, and potentially hazardous river currents for short durations.

Water enthusiasts, fisherman, and boaters are encouraged to maintain a safe distance downstream of the dam as well as maintain a heightened awareness of changing river conditions.

RE: Castle Rock Dam – Annual Siren Test

Dear Resident:

Wisconsin River Power Company has two sirens installed in your area to alert you of rapidly rising water levels in the river. In a significant rain event or a dam failure, river flows downstream of the dam could increase very quickly. A rapid rise in water levels may affect your safety as well as your structure. The sirens are centrally located in Quincy Quiet Acres and the area of Elk Street and 19th Street near the river.

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission requires Wisconsin River Power Co. to test these sirens annually. The siren test will occur on **Tuesday, October 13, 2020 at 10 a.m.** An alternate date of **Thursday, October 15, 2020 at 10 a.m.** has been chosen in the event that the test cannot be performed on October 13, 2020. When triggered, these sirens will sound for several minutes with a series of high and low tones.
